JOHN BROOKS OF FLECKNOE -LAMB STEALING 1879 RUGBY ADVERTISER

On Monday last, it was discovered that during the night a lamb belonging to Mr Hancox, farmer, had been killed in the field and the carcass taken away. The police were communicated with, and after a search found part of the missing lamb in the house of a labourer called John Brooks, living at Flecknoe. Portions of the ribs had been made into a pie, a bit of the loin, which had been roasted, was found in a box over the oven, and a quantity of small bones, partly burnt, were under the grate. Brooks was apprehended, and in answer to a question from his wife as to where he got it from, he said he had sent to Rugby for it. Since Brooks has been in custody he has admitted to Mr Hancox that he took the lamb and that the remaining portions of it were in the canal, where they have since been found by the police. Prisoner has been remanded by the Southam Magistrate 10th May 1879.

QUARTER SESSIONS WARWICK.

Lamb stealing at Flecknoe: John Brooks of Flecknoe, labourer, pleaded guilty to stealing a lamb from a field belonging to Mr Benjamin Hancox, in May last, and was sentenced to 6 months hard labour. 5th July 1879

1925

Application to Nuneaton Combination First Division was accepted.
Application to Nuneaton Bible Class League was accepted

10th July

Proposed by Mr. **Booton** and seconded by Mr. F. **Wilson** that Mr. C. H. **Burton** be appointed Honorary Secretary.
That Mr. Chas **Wells** again to be invited to stand as President.
That Mr Z. **Kendell**, Mr. H. **Pickering**, Mr. J. **Wolfe**, Mr. J. **Baxter**, Mr. W. **Bosworth**, Mr. T.W. **Kendell** to stand as Vice presidents.

August 14th.

That Mr. Alec **Bosworth** be appointed Captain and Mr. J. **Stringer** be appointed Vice- Captain of First Eleven and Mr. R. **Brookes** again Capt., of Second Eleven and Mr. J. **Draycott** be Vice-Captain.
That the subscription to the club be 3/6d and 3d per week with 1d insurance added making 4d per week.
That we enter for 'Nuneaton Hospital Minor Cup' and also 'Railway Orphan Charity Cup'.
That we shall give a Pipe and Pouch to the Nuneaton Combination Prize Draw.

October 28th

That we send a letter to Mr. **Eden** asking for a different referee to take charge in the Birmingham Junior Cup against Griff Colliery, owing to the personal grievance Mr. A. J. **Beasley** has against our club and players.

With regard to Mr H. **Grubb's** transfer from Chilvers Coton F.C. This Club will not give the necessary signature until Mr. **Grubb** is a bona-fide member. Bonafide member being a member who is straight on the club's books. It was proposed that H. **Grubb** pays the debt to Chilvers Coton.
That we purchase a new set of jerseys value 30/-, these being used only for changing when the away team clash. Colours being White.

1928

October 2nd The first matter that arose was with respect to J. **Bratt** becoming a committee member, and it was moved and seconded that his nomination be brought up at *General Meeting*, and if the players were agreeable, then this nomination would again be referred to Committee.

As, unfortunately the Doctor had forbidden C. W. **Hopkins** to play again this season, it was duly carried that he be asked to sit on committee.

Two committee men offered to lend the Club a pound each to purchase new Jerseys, Mr. **Booton** was instructed to bring these back from Birmingham on Saturday if possible.

The team to oppose Arley was selected as follows - C. H. **Burton**, A. **Lister**, R. W. **Kendell**, F. G. **Bosworth**, A. **Shephard**, A. E. **Neale**, A. **Bosworth**, A. **Grubb**, F. **Flowers**, L. **Huxley**?

October 30th

The first matter that arose was respect to the Coventry Cup, and as there was a general meeting fixed it was proposed that we be represented at that meeting by Mr. A. **Lester** and Secretary.

Mr. **Booton** then read out a letter from the League expressing appreciation for the way we carried out the Footballers Service.

It was moved that we approach Bond Gate F.C. respecting changing of ground for the first round of the Chapel End Cup. This was adopted as it was considered their ground was rather unfit for a Cup-tie. Team to meet Barnacle.
